- 2. Financial Update
 - \$1000 SCC Balance
 - Nov 6 \$203.20 (Halloween hot lunch purchased by Angela Davis) ** This amount came out of the Walkathon Fund.
 - Dec 6 -\$118.27 (Kitchen supplies purchased by Bonnie Gosselin)
 - Dec 18 -\$36.99 (Lynn Wood Christmas concert candy canes & oranges)
 - Jan 24 -\$126.14 (Michelle Fortin Hot Meal expenses)
 - Jan 24 Hot Lunch \$365.00 (approximately) Proceeds to go to Telemiracle
 - Balance = \$718.60

- 3. Buffer Zone for School
 - We discussed the possibility of requesting a 1 km buffer zone prohibiting the spraying of chemicals whether school was in session or not.
 - There was discussion around the size of a buffer zone, when the buffer zone would be in effect and the process for requesting something like this.
 - It was decided that the school will ask the neighboring farmers to notify the school if they are spraying pesticides during hours when children would be at the school *and ask them if they could not spray during the hours of 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on school days.*
- 4. After School Program
 - Trade & Craft Show Nov.23 raised approximately \$1590
 - Considering a spring fundraiser to ensure program costs are met.
 - May be looking for another worker for next year.
- 5. Grad
 - Grade 8 and kindergarten grad will be June 24
