### 2. Trustee's Report

- \$29 million budget increase for education in province. This covers salary increases
- Province has allotted for an additional 200 EA's throughout the province
- Rural Congress was attended in March with topics such as Ag in the classroom, Parent teacher home visit pilot program,
- WP Sandin held a Wellness Symposium for students that was well received. They had speaker and counters from the health district, wellness activities and sessions on financial literacy
- High School Prince Albert urban busing is now through the City of Prince Albert busing. Bus pass is required.
