3. Trustee Report (attached in electronic file)
 - Two board meetings this year so far
 - Neil Finch and Jeff Court – new Superintendent
 - Carlton track is being resurfaced and artificial turf (less maintenance) long jump/triple jump pits redone – partnered with City of PA
 - This season of track will most likely not occur at Harry Jerome Track, hoping to be done at next year's football season
 - SCC Orientation planned for Oct 4/23 – at a rural school or division office – 5 group meetings per year so that SCCs all on the same page – Oct 4, Nov 2, May 8
 - MLA meeting Sept 25/23 – 3 MLAs coming and agenda formed
 - RM meeting Nov 2/23
4. Treasurers Report (attached in binder)
 - \$7987.54
 - Milk program dropped – not cost effective, only a few families took part of program
5. New Business
 - Use donation money - for sports – pinneys, jerseys?, chrome books, supplies for new outdoor sandbox, another cement pad for basketball court – multipurpose pad? Field trips? Emphasis on chrome books as the school division does not provide budget for this – a school based initiative – Tracey to look into a “wishlist” on how many chrome books needed
 - Annual trip to Waskesiu for 7/8s – possibly look into camping trip there?
 - Possibly looking at 7/8s going to Camp Kinaseo – 7/8s in the past fundraised for this trip as well
 - Tracey to contact Mike Herd for estimate on new cement pad/multipurpose pad
 - We will continue to think of ideas and bring forward to next meeting
 - Next meeting late Oct/Early Nov
 - Walkathon/Pancake breakfast – Oct 13/23 - SCC normally does breakfast – buy sausages ahead of time and precooked by parents, pancake cooks, we have extra pancake mix left over from last year, hot chocolate station, have parents help to drive tired students, walkathon to start at 10:15am – possibly have lunches transported by one parent to halfway point – lunch at farmyard, in the past a movie was watched in the afternoon – per each classroom – easier to just have a hot chocolate station with snacks
 - Pancake breakfast – open to the community, all free, kids off buses at 8:30, breakfast to start after kids go to their classrooms – teachers to bring students down to breakfast –

last year we used leftover pancakes/sausage at the hot chocolate station and then froze for emergency lunches

- RCMP to help again by leading the walkathon, Kelsey to reach out to see if they would like to contribute possible community barbeque to walkathon
- Lynn to call JR meats to purchase sausage
- Hot lunch dates: First lunch around Halloween – Boston Pizza – Tracey to contact to see what's available – Nov 1 – will discuss future dates at next meeting
- Remembrance Day Service – Tracey to contact Legion and will get back to us
- Christmas Concert – Wed Dec 20/23
- Bonnie Gosselin has volunteered to paint the Wild Rose sign on the corner of White Star and 693 – she would like to paint it red so it is more visible
- Corey P doing recycling? Lynn to touch base – Debbie has been collecting it in the meantime
- Reading with kids outside of the classroom, volunteers to do this?
- Class Rep Parents? We will include on Walkathon form that is distributed to parents
- Enrollment – 96 students this year, 84 students last year
- Grandparent volunteers to teach dance?
- Savannah Price to look into camps/Treeohsix zip lining/Crickle creek + laser tag for 7/8s yearend trip
- The School Division is looking for substitute bus drivers and EAs – reach out to Sask Rivers if interested
